I am currently storing it in my vehicle, transporting it back and forth from rehearsals, and bringing bags to those who reach out."

In support of Bethany's effort, we will provide space in our church for her to store donations and we'll provide the opportunity for our congregation to support her effort if they choose to. We will place the rolling cart **in front of our church office** in its usual spot to retain any food items you wish to donate for members of the Community Choir who are in need.
