Below is an update on Family Promise as well as a look at what additional services are being planned.

Family Promise: Transforming the lives of families experiencing homelessness because every child deserves a home.

Family Promise of Missoula is a network of 30 congregations and organizations as well as a Network of people who practice hospitality and work together to provide shelter, meals and support to Missoula families who are houseless to help them rebuild their lives. In May 2021, Family Promise joined the YWCA in opening and operating the Family Housing Center. With the help of Family Promise's strong volunteer network and collaboration with the YWCA, we are a strong support for families experiencing homelessness in Missoula.



Family Promise provides a dinner meal for families Monday through Friday. In 2024, we served 10,400 meals! The main dish is prepared by the Missoula Senior Center and Family Promise volunteers provide salad, fruit and desserts to complement the meal. Funds from this campaign will go toward covering the cost of dinner to feed families and other expenses to run Family Promise.

In collaboration with the Housing Advocate Network, we also provide prevention services. Last year we were able to provide support to 24 families to keep them in their housing, with only one family going into shelter at the Family Housing Center. In 2025, we are excited to begin a Stabilization program to serve families once they are housed to promote housing stability and self-sufficiency. Families will work alongside a coach and a "Just Neighbors" team for up to a year to gain skills to remain in housing and become connected with a community of belonging.

Green Notes: Let's Do Lunch, and Talk Sustainability!

Day to day, do your actions contribute to the sustainability of life on our home planet? How often do you think about your impact on the future of life on Earth? We hope you'll join the Green Team after church this Sunday, May 18 for a potluck lunch and table talk about how each of us can adopt a more sustainable lifestyle. We think you'll enjoy the meal, the companionship and the ideas you can put into action this summer! The most-quoted definition of sustainability comes from the United Nations World Commission on Environment and Development: "Sustainable development is development that meets the needs of the present without compromising the ability of future generations to meet their own needs."

Native Americans have practiced sustainability for millennia, always looking ahead seven generations. How will my actions – or our collective actions – affect those who live on this land for seven generations to come?

The idea of sustainability is often broken down into three pillars: economic, environmental and social – or, informally, into profits, planet and people. What can we, the people of Missoula First United Methodist Church, do this summer to achieve healthier lifestyles? Bring your thoughts to Sunday's lunch. We will too!

And bring a side dish or dessert, if you're so inclined. Green Team members will bring main dishes.

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Common Good Missoula: May 29th Assembly

In the March City-Wide Listening Session we heard compelling stories of the local impact of executive orders on individuals and families in our community – stories of economic as well as personal security being directly affected. The critical next step for the 22 member and partner organizations of Common Good Missoula (CGM) – including our church – is to discern specific areas of action we can effectively take together.

That is why *it is so important* for as many of us as possible to gather with representatives of the other 21 organizations at the **CGM Delegates Assembly on Thursday, May 29th**. The Assembly will be held right here in our church on that date from 6:00 to 8:00 pm. (Come early if you would like to purchase a meal from a food truck.)



At the Assembly, to sharpen our awareness of what is at stake, we will hear stories from people who are being impacted. We will then discern one or two areas of focus, and be called on to commit to moving those actions forward through Action Research Teams.
