If you haven't started making your life easier and the work of the church more efficient by using our online giving software, Breeze, please consider doing so. Here **(or elsewhere in this newsletter)** are ten great reasons for using Breeze. You'll find full instructions for getting started below.


Our financial secretary, Leslie Uhlenbruck, has worked her magic to compile information about your pledges and payments in one easy-to-access place. Those numbers at her fingertips, and yours. Time for you to start exploring.

Let's start by learning how to create or sign into your Breeze account. You do not need to have an account to give through Breeze, but setting up an account will make subsequent gifts easier to schedule.

- Enter firstumcmissoula.org into your browser.
- Choose GIVE from the menu at the top.
- Scroll down until a heart/arrow graphic and the words GIVE ONLINE breeze appear on the left.
- Click on <u>Click here to donate via BREEZE</u>. A new screen will appear, asking for specifics about your gift to the church.
- **Before you start eagerly typing in information,** note that near the bottom there is gray lettering saying Sign In | Create Account.
  - If you choose not to activate an account, check in next month for a tutorial on how to enter donation information.

If you have already activated your account, continue to #7.

#### **Tzedakah Pocket Offers Hope**

2024 remains a challenge for us with so many requests for assistance coming our way. Even with the difference between our income and outgo we are still in the black because of your generous year-end donations and the money our Foundation gave us. We, and those who seek our help, are grateful. "Lodging" requests are intermittent and the "Lodging" requests we have received so far are ones representing a bridge to more permanent housing. Our "Rent/Security Deposit" requests are higher this month but, here again, they represent our help in keeping individuals and families in their current housing or helping them get into more permanent housing. Our "Other" category continues to be where we see the largest number of requests. These include payment of storage unit rents so people don't lose all their possessions while they try to find housing, paying application fees for those looking for housing, settling outstanding debts so applying for housing is possible, buying gas/gift cards, etc. We can't

predict when we will get assistance requests or how much will be needed to satisfy each request but we are here to help and, as always, we do as much as we can with what we have. We appreciate the congregation's support of this ministry. Without you there is no funding to assist those who come to us for help. A recap of assistance provided by our church's Tzedakah Pocket ministry is shown below.

## Green Notes: Plastic Jesus – Real Faith in a Synthetic World

This April, to mark Earth Day 2024, First Church's Green Team will utilize a new guidebook from Creation Justice Ministries to educate ourselves and our congregation on the global perils of plastic pollution.

Each Sunday in our Green Notes column, we'll provide a new installment in the series, with links to additional information we can each read and think about during the week.



The first thing we all need to understand: We cannot recycle ourselves out of the plastic crisis.

Here's a brief primer on the series, called "Plastic Jesus: Real Faith in a Synthetic World," provided by Derrick Weston of Creation Justice Ministries. Weston writes:

Plastic first started being created on a global scale in the 1950's. Since then annual plastic production has exploded to an estimated 460 million tons as of 2019.

While plastic has many beneficial uses, single use plastics have become a real environmental threat. All manner of groceries and consumer goods come with plastic wrappings that ultimately end up in landfills, or worse, in our waterways. Those plastics then make their way into our food systems and ultimately into our bodies.

Some studies estimate that the total mass of microplastic particles consumed by adults corresponds to 50 plastic bags per year or one credit card per day.

Plastic pollution is only one side of the problem. We also need to consider the health risks created by plastic production. People who live near plastic production facilities experience disproportionate levels of cancer, organ malfunction, impaired sensory organs and birth defects.

These facilities are also disproportionately located near black, brown, and low income communities. Adding to this, over 99% of plastic is made from fossil fuels. It's estimated that by 2050, 20% of the oil consumed will be used for plastic production.

This is not a problem we can recycle our way out of. Less than 14% of plastic packaging is recycled. And plastics can live in on in our ecosystem for up to 500 years.

All of these facts can be found in our Earth Day resource, "Plastic Jesus: Real Faith in a Synthetic World". We believe that before churches can take action, they have to understand the scope of the issue.

We want to encourage you and your community of faith to find ways that you can address this critical issue.

**Please join First Church's Green Team** for this important month-long examination of the perils of plastic pollution – and what we can do as a congregation and community to address the threat.
