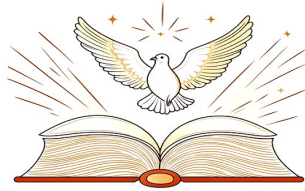


Celebration of Ministries - May 30, 2026

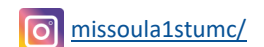

Green Notes: Your Vote is Your Prayer

"I often say that a vote is a kind of prayer for the world we desire for ourselves and for our children. And our prayers are stronger when we pray together."

Georgia Sen. Raphael Warnock spoke those words recently during a podcast appearance with former Montana Sen. Jon Tester and journalist Maritsa Georgiou. They provide an apt reminder as Montanans go to the polls this Tuesday, June 2 to narrow the field of candidates for state, federal and local offices competing in November's midterm elections.

Your vote is your prayer – your most fervent wish for the future. Warnock, a minister by profession, also was speaking of not only the primary votes occurring across the country this month, but also of the ongoing redistricting fights being waged in legislatures and courtrooms nationwide and about why voter turnout will matter so much in the 2026 general election.

There is no overstating the importance of voting this year– both in this summer's primaries and in the November election, Warnock said. You can listen to the entire podcast at this link on YouTube. If you haven't cast your ballot yet in Tuesday's Montana primary, there is still time. Missoula County's Elections Office is exceedingly helpful and fair, and both voter registration and ballot drop-off are possible at the 140 North Russell Street Elections HQ.

It is too late to safely mail your ballot for Tuesday's election, because the Postal Service cannot guarantee its arrival by Election Day. So you need to take the paperwork to the Elections Center. There's lots more information on missoulavotes.gov. Or call 406-258-4751.
