

Climate Action: Hear the Amazing Katharine Hayhoe

First United Methodist will join climate activists from across Montana for an online conversation with scientist/author Katharine Hayhoe at 5:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 27.

One of the most influential climate communicators in the nation, Hayhoe is a public policy and law faculty member at Texas Tech University and author of “Saving Us: A Climate Scientist’s Case for Hope and Healing in a Divided World.”

In “Saving Us,” she argues that when it comes to changing hearts and minds, facts are only part of the equation. We must find shared values to transform our unique individual perspectives into collective action.

Tuesday’s conversation will begin with a presentation by Hayhoe, followed by a Q&A open to all on the live call – including our congregation members, who will gather in the church library. All friends and members of First UMC are invited to attend!

The program is hosted by Families for a Livable Climate, Climate Smart Missoula, Mountain Mamas, Moms Clean Air Force Montana, and the Park County Environmental Council.
