

Immigration Law and Justice Arizona Ministry: Our church has begun its 2nd year of a 3-year commitment in the amount of \$2,000 for this ministry (formerly known as Arizona Justice For Our Neighbors). While our congregation currently supports immigrant asylum seekers through the Southwest Desert Conference of the Methodist Church, note that our Mountain Sky Conference is considering the potential for an Immigration Law & Justice Program. Migrants fearing for their lives are extremely vulnerable and encounter little chance of success with their asylum claims without legal assistance. Immigration Law & Justice provides education workshops on asylum law, 5-10 hours of legal assistance, legal assistance with detailing their

story of persecution plus document translation for required evidence. This program also engages in community education and advocacy programs. Until the United States develops immigration policies that demonstrate some empathy and compassion, this is a way our church can set an example. Green Notes: There's a Power Plant on Our Roof!

Buckle up, Green Notes readers. We're going to crunch some numbers. Halfway through March, the solar panels on First Church's roof have already produced 1.29 megawatt-hours of electricity this month. That's more production than any other full month – let alone two weeks – since the 66 panels were installed last August.

In fact, since the array went online last October, we've generated a total of 3.49 MWh of power. So the last two weeks have been significant – great news for the future of our church and our commitment to clean electricity.

But what does it mean to generate a megawatt-hour of electricity? How much is that?

Well, the folks at SolarEdge, who track First UMC's power production, say our solar power already has prevented 5,411 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions from entering Earth's atmosphere. By comparison, an average gas-burning car emits about 4 pounds of CO2 in an hour. So we've kept an important amount of greenhouse gas emissions out of the atmosphere in a few short months.

But how much power is a megawatt-hour? How about this: Between March 1 and March 15, First Church's rooftop power plant produced more than enough electricity to meet the instantaneous demand of 750 homes – all at once. Or, alternately, it's enough electricity to fully power 330 homes for an hour. That's how much you can do with 1 MWh of electricity – and we generated more than that in the past two weeks.

If you're not too dizzy from all the numbers we've thrown at you, here's the take-home message: We're on our way! First Church's solar array is functioning as it should, producing clean electricity – more electricity than we need on the sunniest days, so we're shipping some production onto the grid. We're doing our part to help Missoula achieve its goal of 100 percent clean electricity.

Amen! And hallelujah!
